DECISION AWARDING DAMAGES¹

Vowell, Chief Special Master:

On July 21, 2014, Linda Haft filed a petition for compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. §300aa-10, *et seq.*² [the “Vaccine Act” or “Program”]. Petitioner alleged that she suffered a shoulder injury which was caused in fact by the influenza vaccine she received on October 17, 2013. Petition at 1. The case was assigned to the Special Processing Unit of the Office of Special Masters.

On October 16, 2014, I issued a ruling on entitlement, finding petitioner entitled to compensation. On December 9, 2014, respondent filed a proffer on award of compensation [“Proffer”] indicating petitioner should be awarded \$106,160.00, an amount representing “all elements of compensation to which petitioner would be entitled under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(a) for her vaccine-related injury.” Proffer at 1. According to respondent’s Proffer, petitioner agrees to the proposed award of compensation. *Id.*

Respondent indicates petitioner is a competent adult and guardianship is not required in this case. *Id.* at 2.

Pursuant to the terms stated in the attached Proffer, **I award petitioner a lump sum payment of \$106,160.00 in the form of a check payable to petitioner, Linda Haft.** This amount represents compensation for all damages that would be available under § 300aa-15(a).

The clerk of the court is directed to enter judgment in accordance with this decision.³
